Collections

Thank you, for our collections last week, we raised
£295.62 for the running of the parish and

£572.09 for the Parish Maintenance Programme

These sums include monies given in Gift Aid envelopes. Our thanks also go to those who donate by Banker's Order direct into the parish account.

Today's second collection is for the work of the Catholic Trust for England and Wales (CaTEW).

CaTEW is a Trust established by the Bishops' Conference to help carry out the administration and policies of the Bishops of England and Wales so that they may proclaim the Gospel to the people of England and Wales as a whole. A small part of the work of the Trust is to help promote the new translation of the Roman Missal in English which comes into effect this autumn and to guide us through the changes. The new translation offers a fuller expression of the content of the original texts of the Roman Missal and a closer connection with the Sacred Scriptures which inspires so much of our liturgy. Also, there is a recovery of a vocabulary that enriches our understanding of the mystery we celebrate. All of this requires a unique style of language and expression, one that takes us out of ourselves and draws us into the sacred, the transcendent and the divine. The publication of the new translation of the Missal is a special moment of grace in the English-speaking world. It offers an opportunity to deepen our knowledge and understanding of the mystery we celebrate each week. This itself will help us to move towards that fuller and more conscious and active participation in the liturgy to which the Church invites us. It will help us also to examine the dignity with which we celebrate the 'source and summit' of the Church's life. Let us support the work of the Catholic Trust for England and Wales and welcome the new translation of the Roman Missal as a sign of our unity and a powerful instrument of God's grace in our lives. Further details about the implementation of the changes will be given in July.
